


Impact Weather Briefing for: Friday, January 22, 2016



WATCHES/ADVISORIES: All of South Florida remains in a marginal risk for severe weather today. Small Craft Advisories are in effect this morning, then Gale Warnings are in effect late this afternoon/tonight through Saturday. A Coastal Flood Advisory is in effect for the Gulf Coast today and Saturday.

OVERVIEW: A fast moving cold front will push through South Florida today. A line of thunderstorms, with a few embedded strong storms are possible into mid-morning west coast, and late morning/afternoon east coast. Behind the front, strong west-northwest winds will create hazardous marine conditions through much of the weekend. Minor coastal flooding is possible along the Gulf coast today and Saturday. Another chilly air mass arrives behind the front, with the coldest temperatures and wind chills Sunday morning.

POTENTIAL IMPACTS





WIND:

- Wind gusts 58 mph or greater possible in strongest storms today
- Winds may gust to 35 mph at times on Saturday





TIDAL FLOODING:

- Minor coastal flooding and beach erosion possible along Gulf coast today and Saturday during high tide cycles.
- Minor street flooding possible Gulf coast today through Saturday.





MARINE:

- Gale force gusts possible tonight through Saturday Night, Gulf and
 Atlantic waters, creating very hazardous seas through Saturday night.
- High Risk of Rip Currents Gulf Beaches today





TEMPERATURE:

- Low temperatures upper 30s-mid 40s interior, and mid 40s along both coasts Saturday Night
- Lowest wind chills, low-upper 30s interior and low 40s along coasts
