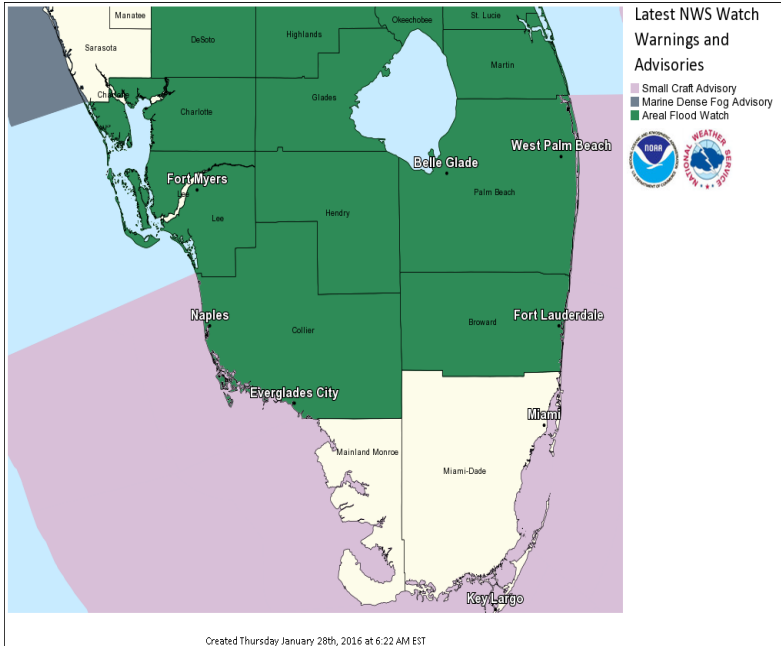


National Weather Service Miami - South Florida



Impact Weather Briefing for: Thursday, January 28, 2016



WATCHES/ADVISORIES: Much of South Florida is under a Flood Watch for today and part of this evening. Marginal Risk for Severe Weather continues today.

OVERVIEW: Conditions remain favorable for embedded strong to severe wind gusts along with isolated tornadoes across the region. Line of thunderstorms now moving across extreme SW FL may progress into Broward and Miami-Dade in the next few hours. Another line of strong to severe thunderstorms is possible with the cold front moving through South Florida mid to late afternoon today.

Additional 2 to 4 inches of rainfall is expected today, and combined with 2 to 6 inches across the region yesterday, roadways and canals will be more susceptible to flooding. The Flood Watch may need to be extended to Miami-Dade later today.

	 MOD.	<p>FLOODING:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> A Flood Watch has been issued for much of the region. Roadways, canals and local waterways are more susceptible to flooding today.
