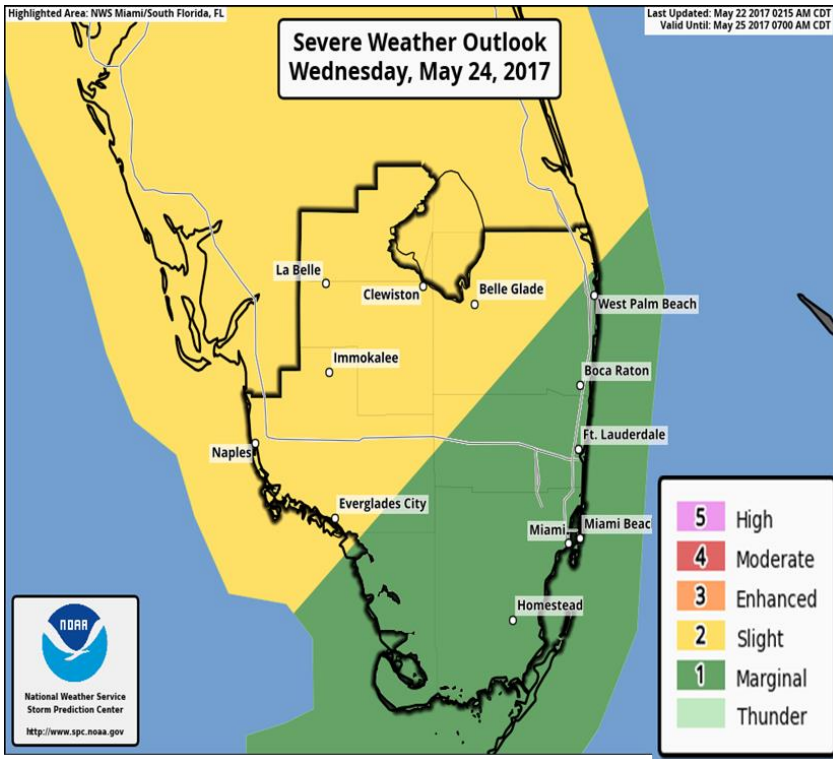


# National Weather Service Miami - South Florida



## Impact Weather Briefing for: Monday, May 22, 2017



**WATCHES/ADVISORIES: None at this time**

**OVERVIEW:** A cold front will approach South Florida Wednesday into Thursday. Ahead of the front, isolated to scattered severe thunderstorms will be possible across the region. At the present time, damaging winds look to be the primary threat, although an isolated tornado or two cannot be ruled out along with lightning and locally heavy rain.

In addition to the potential for severe thunderstorms, hazardous marine conditions may be possible along with an increased risk of rip currents for the Gulf beaches.

It is still too early to pinpoint the timing of the window of greatest concern for possible severe storms, and this window may change as we get closer in time, so stay tuned.
