To assist **YOU** we have developed *special weekend classes* centric to Mastering the General Class knowledge-base and Passing the Exam.

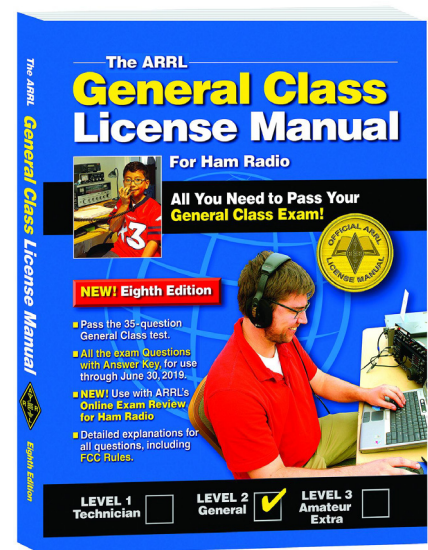
